The Canfield Heritage Foundation is proud to announce a guided walk through the Canfield Cemetery, hosted by renowned local historian Wendell Lauth. The tour will start at 2pm at the Canfield East Cemetery on East Main Street (Route 224).

The tour includes the burial sites of many of Canfield's most noted citizens and veterans. Learn what family's tombstones are the oldest, what brothers lost their lives serving our country, who was Canfield's earliest merchant. In addition to the headstones of early physicians, farmers and innkeepers, the graves of an

abolitionist and Underground Railroad Conductor will be visited. Did you know an early settler buried here was a lawyer, member of Congress as well as a veteran of the War of 1812? You will also learn who was Canfield's first postmaster and sheriff of Trumbull County.
